Curriculum for Basic Awareness Program for Rifle/Pistol Coaches

GENERAL

1. The National Shooting Sport Federation of Sri Lanka is the Controlling Body for the sport of Target Shooting with Rifle, Pistol or Shotgun in the events conducted and governed by the International Shooting Sport Federation and the Commonwealth Shooting Federation.

It is evident that the majority of athletes representing about 19 member clubs in local competitions sanctioned by NSSF are Juniors & Youths.

There are nearly fifty coaches currently performing at various levels. But, very few coaches have produced noticeable results during recent past and the average scores in all past competitions are yet to reach the competitive standards at the international level.

Thus, it is the responsibility of local coaches to discover the hidden talents of youngsters through proper identification and selection process and subsequently uplift their skills through proper guidance whilst creating and increasing the enthusiasm.

In order to achieve the desired optimum results from athletes, the coaches should enhance their basic knowledge about Organizational Aspects, Rules and usage of modern Equipment while upgrading the instructional ability and knowledge. Having above objective in mind, two training programs has been planned to impart the information/knowledge amongst the coaches.

AIM

2. To acclimatize the individuals who are currently performing as coaches on basic Organizational expectations.

- 3. All the candidates shall fulfil following requirements:
 - a. Owning a copy of latest edition of Official Statutes Rules and Regulations of ISSF and having basic knowledge of the same as the course is conducted as a book reference course in a form of discussions.
 - b. A basic knowledge of English.

4. The Course will be conducted in Sinhala medium. But most of the literature used during the course will be in English.
